Celebrating Our New School Values through the 'Launch Into Learning' program

This week all classrooms are engaged in our Launch Into Learning program. This is a program that the whole school participates in and is focused on building relationships and setting expectations for the year ahead. Last year, as part of the school review, students in grades 3-6 voted on new school values.

Our revised school wide values are:

Curiosity: We ask questions to learn **Achievement:** We persist and try our best

Respect: We show care and compassion for others and the

environment

Responsibility: We are in control of our learning and our actions

Empathy: We treat others with care and compassion

Through the 'Launch Into Learning' activities, we aim to achieve:

- clear, explicit and shared expectations and processes in all classrooms
- a collaborative style of teaching and learning
- an understanding of school wide behaviour expectations and values
- an understanding of 'Circle Time'
- a sense of responsibility and active involvement in decision making
 - a sense of fairness, consistency, security and belonging
 - an awareness of the behaviours that demonstrate the values held
 - more self-directed learners who are able to take action for themselves.

This is a positive way to start our year and will ensure that students, teachers and parents all have strong, open and honest relationships, that will carry on throughout the school year.



Updating Medical Records

The Department of Education requires **School Asthma Action Plans and Anaphylaxis Plans** to be updated annually. Existing and newly diagnosed Asthmatics must have an Asthma Action plan (available from the School Office). Please complete this form and return to school as soon as possible. A doctor's signature is required. Anaphylaxis Plans are obtained through the doctor also.

If your child requires Panadol etc. during school hours please complete a Medical Authorisation Form and supply your own Panadol to the front office. Students are not permitted to carry any medication in their schoolbags or self-administer any medication.
