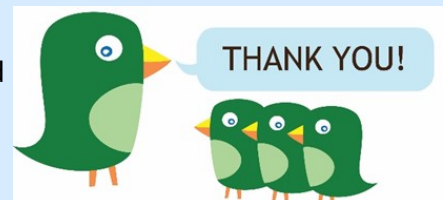
## Ben's Shed Celebrations

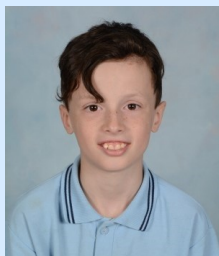
## Thank You Paul Thompson

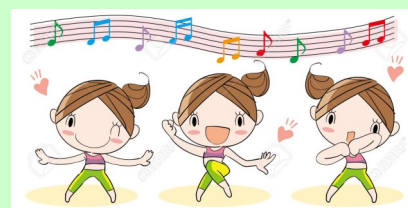

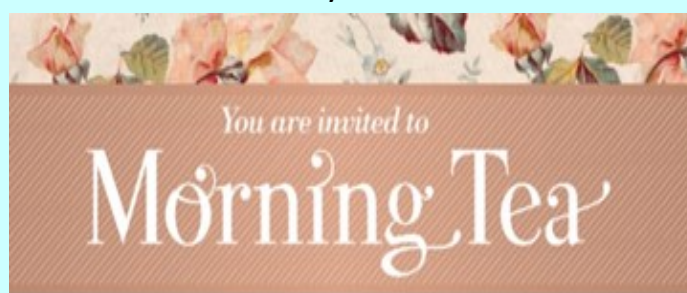

We are pleased to announce that Bluebird Music Studios will be tutoring various musical instruments to student participants at Launching Place Primary School starting at Term 1 of 2019. We offer half hour tuition at the cost of \$25 dollars per student with a discounted price of \$20 for those wishing to participate in a group lesson (2 students per class).
